

If you did not take the flower making workshop with Beverly Mannes, you really missed a good one. I had so much fun, now I have to incorporate the flowers into a wall hanging.






DAY TIME QUILTING BEE

Below is the dessert that Charlotte brought to the January meeting. Several members requested that it be put in the newsletter. Thank you Charlotte.....

Olive Nut Spread

8 oz. cream cheese, softened (I used light)
1/2 cup mayonnaise (I use Hellmans)
3/4 cup finely chopped pecans
1 cup chopped green olives (about a 7oz. jar)



Squeeze as much liquid out of the chopped olives as you can, and save a little bit of it. Combine the softened cream cheese, mayonnaise, and a little of the olive juice, enough so the mixture is not too stiff. Mix in the olives and pecans. Let it refrigerate at least an hour or two. Serve with your favorite crackers.


Some 4 for \$1.00 prizes include Appliqué patterns, a set of FQ's, and some quilt books.


Tickets are 4/\$1.00 and the big raffle ticket is \$1.00 each.

GEORGIA STATE CAPITOL

The **Southeastern Quilt & Textile Museum** is holding their 1st Quit Show on Monday, January 31, 2011 under the Gold Dome at the Georgia State Capitol Building, 214 State Capitol, Atlanta 30334. This is a one day show from 8AM to 5PM. There are 46 quilts in the exhibit representing all parts of Georgia.

You are invited to be part of this historic exhibit. This will be the first quilt show held at the Georgia State Capitol. Each quilt on display has been made by a quilt guild or an individual for the exhibit. Most of the quilt makers will be present for this event. These quilts are the first exhibit for the new Southeastern Quilt & Textile Museum. All of these quilts will be part of an auction at the end of the museum exhibit with the proceeds benefiting the museum.

Quilters from all over Georgia are converging on the Georgia State Capitol on Monday January 31. Come be part of this group and mingle with fellow quilters from all over Georgia. Quilters are coming from Savannah, Valdosta, Blue Ridge, Blairsville, Calhoun, Carrollton, Columbus and all part in between.

There will be displays from Carrollton and Carroll County and the Southeastern Quilt & Textile Museum. The Story of Cotton will be visually displayed. The Georgia Quilt Council will also be on hand to meet with all the quilters. The SQTM will have a photographer available all day for a pectoral record. Everyone is urged to contact their legislator to let them know you will be at the capitol. Television and newspapers have been invited to attend this event.
