The information on the quilt displayed the name, "**Tres Amigos-Havana Harmony**" by Kay Braunig Donges from Blairsville, GA. With permission the three figures on the quilt are from those paintings done by the restaurant's owner's mother.*"

Medallion Mystery Quilt Along

I know several of you seemed interested in the upcoming Medallion Mystery Quilt Along when I brought it up at the September meeting. I've been working on the design and will be ready to start the Quilt Along in November. So, let's talk about the basics of the Quilt Along so you can pick out your fabric and be ready to start!

WHAT IS IT?

Here is a fun project for everyone to do!! The Medallion Mystery Quilt Along will be a 10 month mystery. We will start in November with the 12" finished center medallion (12 1/2" unfinished). I will give you two choices but you can do whatever 12" finished block you would like to do. You can be as creative as you like!! Then every 2 months (January - March - May - June) you will get 2 options for the next row that will go around the medallion. 2 options - 1 "Easy" and 1 "harder". I didn't go super hard - I want this to be fun for everyone!! Won't it be fun to see how many different options we come up with?

HOW WILL I GET THE PATTERNS?

The patterns will be published in the HCQG Newsletter. This way, if you can't attend the meeting, you can still get the patterns. You can study them and decide which one you want to do.

YOU CHOOSE YOUR FABRICS!

You choose your color palette. A two or three color palette with a neutral might work or you can go scrappy or controlled scrappy. Pick a collection or a family of fabrics - pastels, florals, brights, two colors, solids, Fall, Christmas - Your Choice.

HOW MUCH FABRIC WILL I NEED?

I can't give you specific fabric amounts because I don't know how you are going to use the patterns or which pattern you will use. What I can tell you is you will need approximately 8 - 10 yards of fabric total. I would estimate you will need 3-4 yards of neutral/background fabrics and 5-6 yards of focus fabrics.

WHAT WILL THE FINAL SIZE BE?

The final size will be 72" x 72". You don't want it to be that big? Don't do all the rows. Want it to be bigger? Add some additional rows.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T LIKE THE BORDER OPTIONS?


If you don't like my 2 choices, you can do something else. I will only cry for a minute. JUST KIDDING! I want to see your creativity!!



How-to Notes	
	Bisect square on one diagonal
	Bisect square on both diagonals
*All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless noted otherwise	

1 	Fabric 1 Cut 4 squares $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut 4 squares $2\frac{7}{8}$ " and bisect on one diagonal Cut 1 square $5\frac{1}{4}$ " and bisect on both diagonals
2 	Fabric 2 Cut 4 squares $2\frac{7}{8}$ " and bisect on one diagonal Cut 1 square $5\frac{1}{4}$ " and bisect on both diagonals
3 	Fabric 3 Cut 4 squares $2\frac{7}{8}$ " and bisect on one diagonal
4 	Fabric 4 Cut 6 squares $2\frac{7}{8}$ " and bisect on one diagonal
5 	Fabric 5 Cut 4 squares $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

NOTES FOR NAPA VALLEY PATTERN

I used 2 different methods when I created my Napa Block instead of the Piecing Instructions on the pattern -4 Flying Geese at a Time Method– I followed the MondernlyMorgan.com tutorial AND The Magic 8 Half Square Triangle Method





	Cut 1 Square 6" for Magic 8 HST Method
	Cut 1 Square 5 1/4" for 4 Flying Geese Method
Fabric 2 -	Cut 4 Squares 2 7/8"
	Cut 1 Square 5 1/4" for 4 Flying Geese Method
Fabric 3 -	Cut 4 Squares 2 7/8"
Fabric 4 -	Cut 1 Square 6" for Magic 8 HST Method
	Cut 2 Squares 2 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal
Fabric 5 -	Cut 4 Squares 2 1/2"
	Cut Center Square 3 3/8"






Construction Method




