In the process, Kathleen becomes a partner with the artist who painstakingly embroidered on the linen when it was new, sometimes more than 100 years ago.

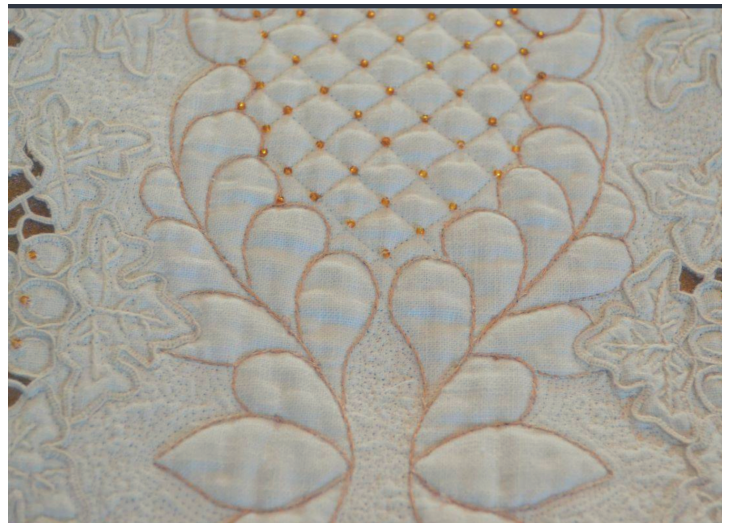
# SUNDAY PEARLS



The new details trigger a transformation in which a piece of table linen, originally meant for a functional purpose, becomes something that draws admiration from viewers as they study the intricate details and gorgeous designs created by not one, but two textile artists.

Kathleen also makes bed quilts, modern quilts, and charity quilts, but it is her linen quilts that are being increasingly featured in shows, festivals, and museums. Please bring in fabric you don't need any longer ( 1 & 1/3 yard minimum for the backs of the quilts - the fronts will be simple 9.5 squares). Flannel backing is a plus for the backing for warmth. Pattern and color do NOT matter! But I'm not picky - donations are appreciated.

We plan to work on these on a future project day, so plan to join us when we announce the workshop! Thanks!

# Medallion Mystery Quilt Along

## 4th Row -

We are doing a simple border to break up each row. This border will be 3 inches finished.

**\*\*NOTE** - If you want to be even more scrappy or adventurous, you can add cornerstones to your strips, or you can do half square triangles - the possibilities are endless!!!

Cutting - 2 strips of your choice of fabric 3.5" x 24.5"

2 strips of your choice of fabric 3.5" x 30.5"

Sew your strips 24.5" strips to the sides of the center medallion and your 30.5" strips to the top and bottom of the center medallion. Your center should now measure 30.5" square.

## 5th Row - Easy Option - Flying Geese

You will need to make 56 - 2.5" x 5" finished size Flying Geese.

You can make them as scrappy or controlled as you want. I would recommend that we go back to the 4 Flying Geese at a Time Method that we used in the center medallion. I followed the ModernlyMorgan.com tutorial found here <https://www.modernlymorgan.com/four-at-a-time-flying-geese-tutorial/> Of course, you are more than welcome to do your favorite method!

Cutting - Assorted squares 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" (14 total squares) to make the body of your geese.

Smaller assorted squares 3 3/8" x 3 3/8" 4 for each background for your geese

(56 squares total).

Once again, you can go as scrappy as you want but I will probably keep each 4 piece unit with the same background.

**If you want your flying geese to all have the same background,** you will need to have 17.5" x WOF.

Cut it into 5 strips 3 3/8" x WOF. Sub cut those strips into the 56 - 3 3/8" x 3 3/8" squares.





## 5th Row – Harder Option – Quarter Square Triangle Blocks

Please check out this website from Bonjour Quilts <https://www.bonjourquilts.com/quarter-square-triangles/> or A Quilting Life <https://www.aquiltinglife.com/easy-quarter-square-triangle-tutorial/> both have similar instructions, but Bonjour Quilts shows you how to do less scrappy versions. You can choose how you want to do your blocks.

You will need 28 blocks 5" finished size blocks

Cutting –

**If you want to do super scrappy** – do all 28 6.5" x 6.5" squares different – a good way to use up your scraps.

**If you want to do controlled scrappy**, pick 4 different fabrics.

Cut 2 strips of each color 6.5" WOF, sub cut the strips into 6 squares, 6.5" x 6.5". 7 squares total from each color.

**If you want to make your blocks like my example below**, pick 3 different fabrics.

Main fabric – Cut 3 strips 6.5" WOF, sub cut each strip into 6 squares, 6.5" x 6.5". 14 squares total

2nd fabric – Cut 2 strips 6.5" WOF, sub cut each strip into 6 squares, 6.5" x 6.5". 7 squares total

3rd fabric – Cut 2 strips 6.5" WOF, sub cut each strip into 6 squares, 6.5" x 6.5". 7 squares total

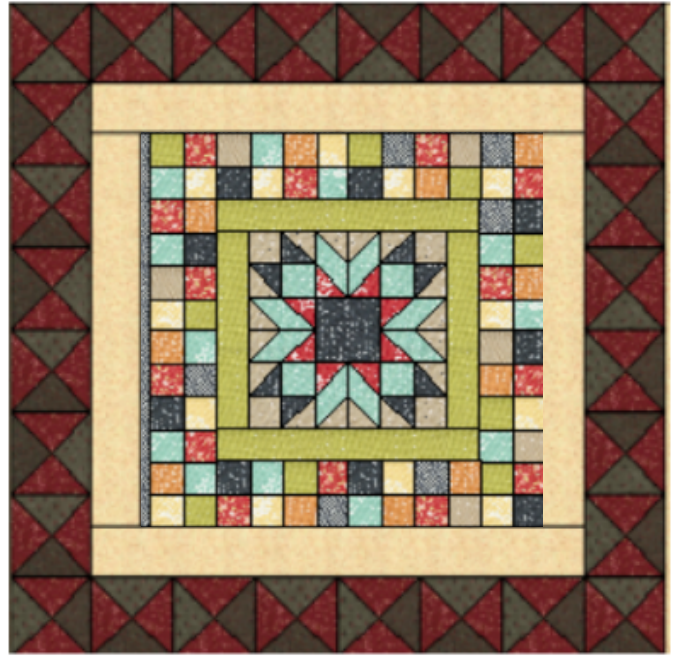
**If you want to do an hourglass block**, choose 2 different fabrics.

Cut 3 strips from both colors 6.5" WOF, sub cut each strip into 6 squares, 6.5" x 6.5". 14 squares from each fabric.

1. Begin by placing two squares right sides together.
2. Mark a line diagonally on the back of the lightest fabric.
3. Sew a ¼" line on either side the line.
4. Cut your squares in half on the line that you drew earlier.
5. Press your fabric open towards the dark side.
6. Next place two half square triangle blocks, right sides together and nest those seams.
7. Mark a line diagonally on the back of the lightest fabric.
8. Sew a ¼" line on either side of the line.
9. Then cut your squares in a half using the center line just like in the step above.
10. At this point you can press the blocks to the dark side or press open.

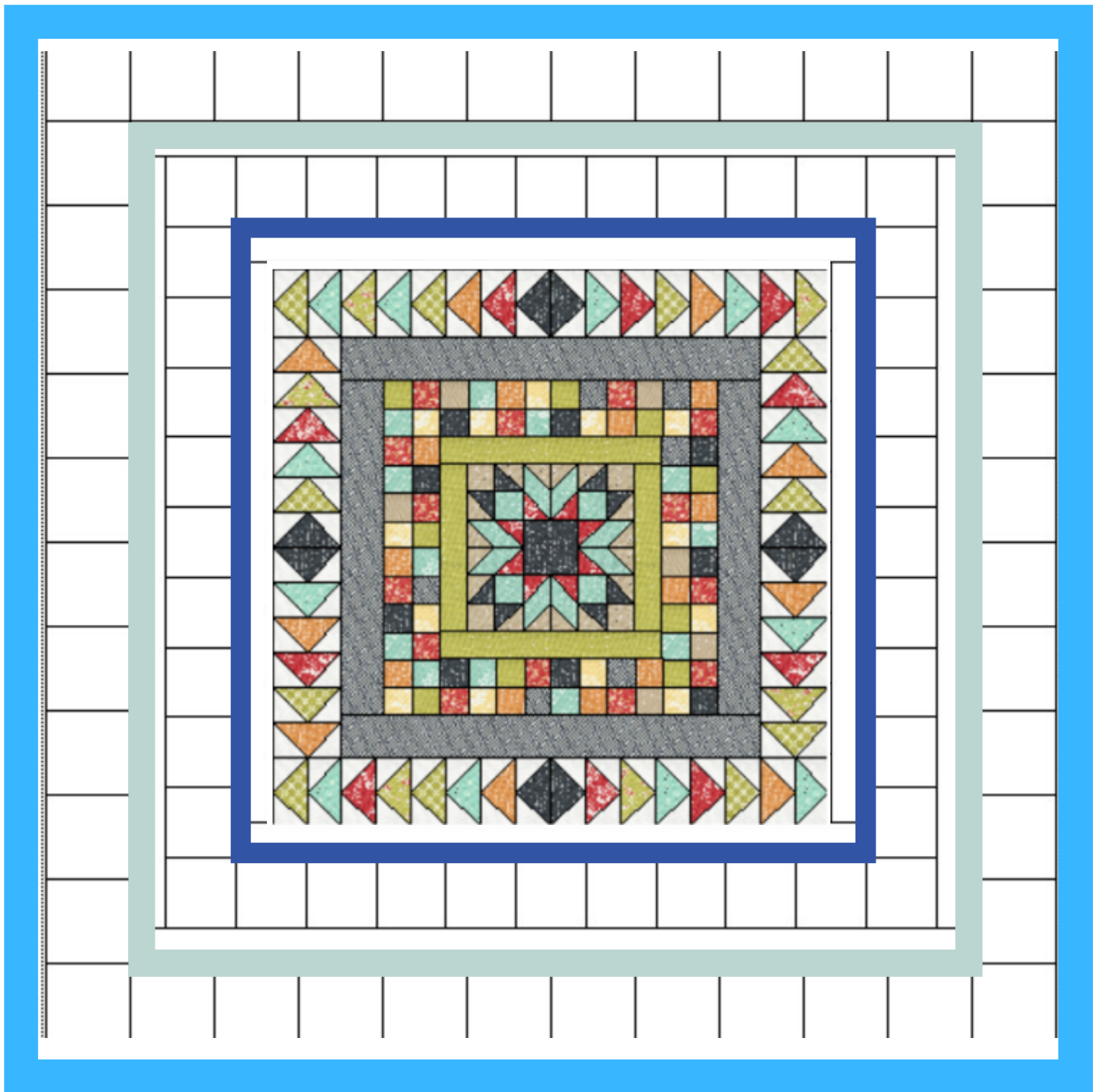
A Quilting Life has a good video tutorial on how to press the blocks. Check it out! At this point you have 4 QST's. Follow the method above 6 more times and you will the blocks you need. Don't forget to trim them to 5.5" unfinished.





Notice how the color placement can change the look of the 5th row.

# GRAPE SODA STUDIO

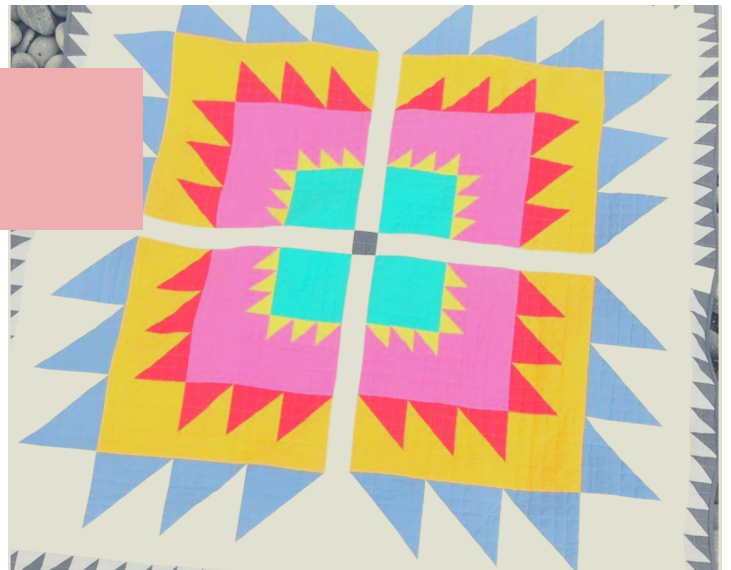
