
October - Stephanie Marbut, from Peace of Threads, Clarkston GA, a non-profit ministry helping refugee women support their families by learning sewing and designing skills.



"Sisters" BOM- Block 11



Jazz up "Friendship Star" with "Four Patch" corner units and "Square in a Square" center to make "Paddle Star." Use a set of 3 fabrics and choose another from your "FREE" box if you like. I used different fabrics from my "FREE" box for the 6" block.

ToT = tone-on-tone **RST** = right sides together

Cutting for the 12" block –

From light background fabric, cut 2 5" squares
From light background fabric, cut a strip 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21"
From large scale print (lilac), cut 2 5" squares
From ToT (dark green) if using FQs, cut a strip 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21;"
if using a 10" square, cut 2 strips 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10"
From small scale print (light green), cut 4 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for center unit
From dark print (black), cut 1 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square for center unit




Sewing the 12" block –


Make 4 "Four Patches" – Use light background 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" strip and ToT (dark green) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide strip(s). Sew RST on a long side. Press seam toward darker fabric. Cross-cut strip set at 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " intervals to make 8 units. Use these 8 "two-patch" units to make 4 "Four Patches," that measure 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$.



Make 4 Half Square Triangles – Use the 2 light background 5" squares and the 2 large scale print (lilac) 5" squares. (If using a stripe, you may wish to cut both squares identically prior to sewing so that stripes will be oriented correctly in the block.) Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of both background squares and place them RST with the large scale print squares. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of drawn lines. Cut apart on the drawn lines and press toward the print. Trim half square triangles to measure 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square.




*Make center “Square in a Square” unit – Use the dark print (black) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square and the four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” (light green) print squares. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” squares. Place a (light green) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square RST in opposite corners of the dark print (black) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square. Orient the diagonal lines as shown and sew on the drawn lines. Flip the resulting triangles upward and outward and match the corners to check sewing accuracy. Then trim away excess seam allowance. Repeat this “triangle corners” construction method with the two remaining (light green) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” squares, placing and sewing them in the remaining opposite corners of the dark print (black) square. Orient the diagonal lines as shown and sew on the drawn lines. Flip the resulting triangles upward and outward and match the corners to check sewing accuracy. Then trim away excess seam allowance. *This unit measures 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square.**




Block Assembly –

Arrange the block and sew together as a “Nine Patch” in 3 rows with 3 units each. *The block measures 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square.* Arrows indicate pressing direction.




Cutting for the 6” block –

From light background fabric, cut 2 3” squares
 From light background fabric, cut a strip 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” x 12,”
 sub-cut into 8 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” squares
 From ToT (red), cut 8 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” squares
 From large scale print (floral), cut 1 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ” square for center
 From small scale print (black) cut 2 3” squares



Sewing the 6" block –


Make 4 "Four Patches" – Sew the 1 ½" background squares and 1 ½" ToT (red) squares together to make 4 "Four Patches." Press seam allowances toward the darker fabric. *The "Four Patches" should measure 2 ½" square.*


Make 4 Half Square Triangles – Use the 2 light background 3" squares and the 2 small scale print (black) 3" squares. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of both background squares and place them RST with the small scale print (black) squares. Sew ¼" away from both sides of drawn lines.

Cut apart on the drawn lines and press toward the print. *Trim half square triangles to measure 2 ½" square.*




Block Assembly

Arrange the block and sew together as a "Nine Patch" in 3 rows with 3 units each. *The block measures 6 ½" square.* Arrows indicate pressing direction.




Cutting Diagrams for 10" squares – for 12" block only





“Sisters” BOM- Block 12

“Sawtooth Star,” a favorite block design of many quilters, looks equally nice and is mathematically simple to draft in many block sizes. Interest is added when a large scale theme print or an additional patchwork block is placed in the center square. The “Sisters” December “Sawtooth Star” variation contains a “Nine Patch” center and “Four Patch” corner squares. The 6” block is simplified by replacing the “Four Patches” with squares of background fabric.

ToT = tone-on-tone **RST** = right sides together



Cutting for the 12” block –

From light background fabric, cut a 7 1/4" square
From light background fabric, cut 8 2" squares
From bold (red) print, cut 4 3 7/8" squares
From ToT (green) fabric, cut 5 2 1/2" squares
From ToT (green) fabric, cut 8 2" squares
From medium floral print, cut 4 2 1/2" squares



Sewing the 12” block –

Make a “Nine Patch” using the 5 2 1/2" ToT (Green) squares and the 4 2 1/2" medium floral print squares. Press the seams toward the darker fabric. *The “Nine Patch” measures 6 1/2" square.*



Make “Flying Geese” by the “four at a time” method.

Use the 7 1/4" background square and 4 (red) bold 3 7/8" squares.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the bold 3 7/8" squares.

Place a 3 7/8" bold square in opposite corners of the 7 1/4" background square, RST.


The corners of the 3 7/8" bold squares will overlap in the center.

Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn line and press the bold triangles away from the background triangle.

Place another 3 7/8" background square in the 90 degree corners of the 2 units made above. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line and press the bold triangles away from the background triangle.

All 4 “Flying Geese” units should measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2."




Next step:



Make 4 Flying Geese






Make 4 "Four Patches."

Use the 8 2" background squares and the 8 2" ToT squares.

Press seams toward the darker fabric.

The "Four Patches" measure 3 1/2" square.

Block Assembly – Use the units made above to make the block. Lay out the pieces as a “Nine Patch” with 3 rows of 3 units in each row. Arrows indicate pressing direction. The block measures 12 1/2" square.



Cutting for the 6" block –

From light background fabric, 4 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles

From light background fabric, cut 4 2" squares

From bold (red) print, cut 8 2" squares

From ToT (green) fabric, cut 5 1 1/2" squares

From medium floral print, cut 4 1 1/2" squares

Sewing the 6" block –




Make a "Nine Patch" using the 5 1 1/2" ToT (green) squares and the 4 1 1/2" light floral print squares. Press the seams toward the darker fabric. The "Nine Patch" measures 3 1/2" square.

Make 4 "Flying Geese" by the “one-rectangle, two-squares” method.

Draw diagonal lines on the wrong side of all 8 bold (red) 2" squares.


Place a bold 2" square at the right-hand end of a background 2" x 3 1/2" rectangle. Orient the drawn line as shown. Sew on the drawn line.

Then flip the resulting triangle upward and outward, matching corners to check for sewing accuracy. After pressing, flip triangle downward and trim away excess seam allowance. Flip triangle upward and outward again.



Place a second bold 2" square at the left-hand end of each background 2" x 3 ½" rectangle unit. Orient the drawn line as shown. Sew on the drawn line. Then flip the resulting triangle upward and outward, matching corners to check for sewing accuracy. After pressing, flip triangle downward and trim away excess seam allowance.

Block Assembly - Use the units made above to make the "Sawtooth" block. Lay out the pieces as a "Nine Patch" with 3 rows of 3 units in each row. Arrows indicate pressing direction. The block measures 6 ½" square.




