


## Birthday Raffle

Even if they aren't a new member, you'll be meeting someone new!









 Cut in half diagonally- corner to corner once


 Cut in half diagonally- corner to corner twice





## **Quilts from Ukraine: Natalia Lashko and Illia Lashko**

### **Love Ukraine With All Your Heart: Examples of the Straw Weaving Technique**

This collection comprises artistic quilts and straw embroidery. All quilts are handcrafted and feature original designs. Ideas stem from various sources, resulting in each piece being crafted in a unique style. The creators hold a profound love for Ukraine; their creations are inspired by beloved Ukrainian folk songs and folklore, particularly from the region of Podillia.

The concept of embroidering with textile straws emerged from the straw-thread embroidery technique, revitalized by a family of artists. This led to an unexpected and captivating visual and tactile outcome, akin to mosaic and painting effects, largely borne from chance. This technique allows for ample improvisation. The quilts are enhanced by appliqué and quilted textures, yielding distinctive light and texture effects. Illia Lashko combines patchwork with straw embroidery in quilts.
