Thanks to all of you who have filled the critter beds. The Northeast Georgia Humane Society staff and the doggies and kitties greatly appreciate your generosity.

I have covers for the beds, all you need to do is put your little scraps into them, sew up the end, give them to me, and I'll deliver them. Please be careful that no pins or large pieces of fabric go in, batting is fine. The beasties like the beds soft and squishy so stuff them loosely. If you choose to make your own beds try to keep them about 20X20 inches.

The Humane Society also needs crate mats. They measure 12X18 inches. This is a great way to use orphan blocks. Add a layer of batting and a back, I don't bind them, just stitch them right sides together, turn them and stitch them up. They don't need to be quilted but a few lines of stitching to hold them in place.

As always they appreciate any gently used towels, sheets and blankets you may have.
